Gordon Young (1919-1998) was a prolific American composer of choral and organ music familiar to several generations of church musicians. A superb organist and choral director, he served churches in Pennsylvania and Oklahoma before becoming the Organist/Choirmaster at First Presbyterian Church, Detroit, Michigan, where he served for many years. He published more than 800 organ and choral compositions. One of his choral works for unaccompanied SATB choir, "The Lord's My Shepherd" (1964), has been adapted & arranged by Douglas Wagner as an organ solo. This arrangement – with Wagner's title of "Psalm 23" – is

this morning's prelude.

The tune accompanying this hymn is RESIGNATION, an anonymous American folk melody that first appeared in Beauties of Harmony, 1828, and later in Southern Harmony, 1835. It was in the 1835 hymnal that the tune was first paired with a paraphrase of Psalm 23 by Isaac Watts (from *The* Psalms of David, *Imitated*, 1719). Psalm 23 remains the most well-loved and often recited psalm, and Watts' powerful paraphrase, coupled with the peaceful vet strong American folk tune, make this hymn a moving rendition of

that psalm.


